FLAG

Mayor Holmberg led the salute to the flag.

COMMUNITY ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mayor Holmberg stated that the High School boys and girls cross country teams won the title in their conference. He stated that the Environmental Commission and Shade Tree Commission will be putting on a program for the 4th grade students at the Wildwood School. Mr. McWilliams stated that the Mayor completed the New York Marathon. Mr. Lester made mention regarding an article that stated that there have been seven CFO's and seven Managers appointed over the last seven years in Mountain Lakes. There have been only four CFO's and four Managers.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mayor Holmberg opened the meeting to the public

Mr. Fred Kanter, 81 Hanover Road, commented on the abandoned vehicle law. He stated that he had asked for amendment of the law for 10 years. He commented that the Borough now has a conforming law.

Laurie Roland Plonski, spoke about Melrose Road. She stated that year round parking on this roadway has taken place for over twenty years on the shoulder. She stated that the Borough is proposing precluding having parking on the road. She stated that cars need to be parked behind the curb to allow for emergency vehicles to pass down the street. She wanted to know why this street was being singled out.

Larry Feiwel, 39 Tower Hill Road, came to discuss the blue line painted on Boulevard. He stated that he just wanted to know what the approval process was.

Joe Plonski, 25 Melrose Road, also spoke regarding the parking on Melrose. He stated that parking should be able to take place on the shoulder of the road. He stated that this takes place on other streets in the Borough. The streets are narrow.

Sue Ann Sylvester, 22 Hanover Road, spoke about the parking on Melrose as well. She asked that this please be clarified.

Tucker Glavin, 65 Bellvale Road, commented on the Beach Renovation project. He commented on non-residents using the beaches. He stated that he understands that the Police are trying to take care of this problem. He suggested that making improvements to the beaches will cause more non-residents to use the beaches.

Alen Brodka, Melrose Road, came to discuss the parking issue on Melrose. He wanted to know why the parking is an issue.



Ms. Lauren McDonald-Brickner, came before the council to discuss the Halloween safe zone. She showed a graph of the amount of people who came to the safe zone. She did an analysis of the amount of candy that was donated and purchased by the Police Department.

BOROUGH COUNCIL DISCUSSION ITMES Street Parking Memo from Mr. Oostdyk

Mr. Oostdyk spoke about street parking and the parking regulations in the Borough. He spoke about parking in right of ways. He stated that if there is no parking on a roadway, there also is no parking in the right of way. He stated that if there is street parking allowed, parking in the right of way is also allowed. There is no such law in Mountain Lakes that states that a vehicle can only park on the paved portion of the roadway.

ATTORNEY'S REPORT

Mr. Oostdyk stated that he had a request from the Hornrock Property people to come before the Council to discuss their development project. They wanted to discuss the project in Executive Session. It was Mr. Oostdyk's recommendation to discuss this topic in open session. He stated that the Hornrock Property people will be intervening in the Declaratory Judgment that was submitted to the Court by the Borough regarding affordable housing. Mr. Oostdyk stated that he did not suggest fighting the intervention.

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COUNCIL REPORTS

Mr. Albergo stated that the HPC is looking to have a new ordinance at the next meeting. Public Safety discussed having the blinking stop sign installed at Midvale intersection. The speed humps will be moved closer to the crosswalks. The police have been sitting at the intersection. He stated that the installation of new conforming street signs has started. He stated that the solid waste committee has begun discussing the trash contract. Mr. Happer stated that there is an opening on the Finance Committee. The budget process is moving forward. Mr. McWilliams stated that the Woodlands Committee desperately needs members. Mayor Holmberg stated that Shade Tree also needs a member. The volunteer reception will be held on December 12th. He stated that there is an audit firm coming in to count the ash trees in the Borough.

Mr. Fred Kanter, made comment regarding Mr. Lester's comment regarding residents doing research on topics that are discussed. He stated that the first round of street signs that were installed were illegal and should be taken down. He made comments regarding the appointment of a new engineer and attorney.

Ms. Laurie Roland Plonski, made comment regarding the parking regulation dealing with no parking during school hours. She stated that she was told that this ordinance was not enforced. She asked Council to look at the intent of this law.

Mr. Plonski, thanked Mr. Lester for listening to him. He reiterated his wife's request to look into the ordinance regarding no parking during school hours.

Mr. Steven Shaw, 4 Point View Place, thanked the four Council members that will be leaving the Council for their hard work.

Ms. Audrey Lane, 31 Melrose Road, thanked the four departing Council members.
