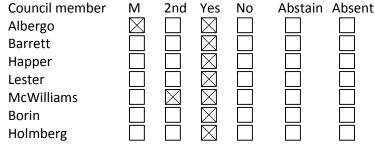

COUNCIL REPORTS

Mr. McWilliams stated that there was a Lakes meeting. A tree will be addressed. The lakes are being treated for weeds and lily pads.

Mr. Borin stated that he attended the Habitat for Humanity event at the High School. It was a great event.

Mayor Holmberg stated that Shade Tree has identified trees that need removal or pruning. He stated that the Personnel subcommittee met. Job descriptions were discussed. Having annual reviews was discussed. Mr. Sheola is currently in the process of conducting annual reviews.

Mr. Fred Kanter, 81 Hanover Road, made a comment regarding the Cove and ADA compliance. He stated that when you change a facility, you need to conform to the ADA regulations. He stated that there were only curb cuts installed and the height of the bench was changed. He made mention of supervision on the lakes at night. He mentioned the blacked out windows of the police cars. He stated that the cars do not need blacked out windows.

Dede Conlan, 310 Morris Avenue, asked why there is a sign at the tennis courts that states that teaching professionals can give lessons. She stated there is a sign regarding not allowing group swim lessons at the beach. She stated that she would like to see the rules for all recreational sports.

Audrey Lane, 31 Melrose Road, asked about the YMCA path. She asked if this is something that will come before Council.

NEXT STEPS AND PRIORITIES

Mayor Holmberg reviewed the following next steps and priorities:

a) Get Mr. Kanter the ordinance regarding the storage of cars on private property



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- b) Mr. Sheola will work with the Chief regarding tinted windows
- c) Reconcile paving plans and the budget
- d) Mr. Sheola will communicate the 10 year plan
- e) Manager's report will include all new hires, the department budget to be paid from and the salary
- f) Policies, rules, regulations, for the park ordinance
- g) Sliding scale financial report regarding debt service for all projects, (Board of Ed and town)
- h) Nonresident use of facilities to be discussed
- i) Review of how swim tests are conducted
- j) Status of house numbering ordinance
- k) Status of hydrant maintenance
- I) Status of CERT program
