### 2023 Master Plan Reexamination Report

The Board along with their professionals reviewed the final draft of the Reexamination Report. Master Plan Committee and Zoning Board member, Meghan Leininger, joined in the Board discussion.

Minor edits were made to section B: Extent Problems and Objectives have been Reduced or Increased since the Master Plan. Those edits included changes to the following subsections: size of residential buildings, housing options, senior housing, circulation issues, recreational fields, commercial zones, and Midvale area town center. Minor changes were also made to section D: The Specific Changes Recommended for the Master Plan or Development Regulations. Those edits included under item #4, mention of the new state Tree Protection Plan, under #8 suggested adopting a green building and environmental sustainability plan element in the Mater Plan, under item #16 add updating the ordinances to include noise and quality of life issues, and in item #21 recommend a "Field Use Assessment" be done to determine the actual demand for additional fields.

Mitchell Stern made a motion to adopt the 2023 Master Plan Reexamination Report as edited and a second was provided by Tom Menard. The Board adopted the report by voice vote of all members present.
