2. Route 46 Development

- Focus is to be Tree Planting with the Shade Tree Commission

5. Committee Liaison Updates:

EDAC

 A meeting was held with the Historic Preservation Committee members on developing area's around Hapgoods/Market for possible commercial development. Morristown, Morris Street Redevelopment Plan is a model and preliminary review.

<u>DPW</u>

- In the next few weeks there will be new Recycling Center Signs and Hours
- A solid waste committee will review the recycling/disposal program and contract

Shade Tree

- Sept/Oct focus is the Prune & Removes in Town, Tree Walks on Right of Way
- Continued focus on Residential ROW Planting will be supported by the MLEC
- A new Tree Inventory Management is being kicked-off to provide more data and trends for Canopy Management. Latest count is we are losing about 291 Trees/year and the Boro is replacing about 30/year.
- BoE has supported new Tree Plantings in Briarcliff (replacing a memorial tree for former principle Cera), and some new plantings at Wildwood school

Student Liaison

- Reactivating plan for a Botanical Garden at the ML High School and proposed to Principle
- The topic of rejuvenating the project to put up more Bat Houses was discussed
