COMMUNITY ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mayor Menard asked for a moment of silence for the 500,000 people who have died from Covid-19.

Mayor Menard made the following announcements: February is Black History Month to recognize the heritage and achievements of black people in the United States; The federal government expects that all people who want to receive a Covid-19 vaccination should be able to do so by July 2021; He encouraged everyone to assist elderly neighbors with signing up for the Covid-19 vaccination or getting to their vaccination appointment; NJ has a property tax reimbursement program available for senior citizens and disabled residents that qualify.

Councilmember Korman announced that applications for the Payroll Protection Program (PPP) are being accepted.

Michael Hadjiloucas - 5 Lakewood Drive, requested that the Wawa Planning Board Application be denied.

Mary Alosio – 6 Scarborough Road, advised the Council of the upcoming programs that the League of Women Voters will be hosting.

Cheryl Dennis - 26 Lakewood Drive Denville, NJ is opposed to the proposed Wawa project and asked questions regarding the project.



Victoria Branchini – 7 Pinewood Lane, asked questions regarding the following: Pinewood Trail Traffic Study, Accessory Apartments Program and Borough recycling. Ms. Branchini offered a suggestion for a 2021 Council goal.

Borough Zoning Official Certification

Recycling Material Vendor – Atlantic Coast Fiber

Atlantic Coast will continue to accept Borough material at their other facilities; however, there will be an increase in costs associated with the transportation of material.

COUNCIL REPORTS

Health Commission – Councilmember Barnett reported that the commission's 2021 project will be to continue their Stigma-free initiative.

Planning Board – Councilmember Lane reported that the board appointed its planner and engineer and also continued hearing the Highview application.

Affordable Housing Committee – Councilmember Lane reported the following: There will be a Zoom information session to learn about the Borough's Accessory Apartments Program on February 24th at 7pm; The resident mailer to announce the accessory apartment program was mailed to residents.

Woodlands Committee – Councilmember Lane reported that the committee is dissatisfied with the gravel/stone choice for the Boulevard trails. The committee discussed the following: Committee goals for the year; Clearing of the Overlook and Crestview Trail paths; Ordering saplings for 2021; Creating a summit meeting of like-minded committees.

Finance Committee – Councilmember Happer reported the following: The committee discussed the 2021 Borough budget; The committee is scheduled to meet with the Borough Auditor on March 24th to discuss bond authorization.

Environmental Commission – Councilmember Happer reported that the commission discussed the stormwater ordinance and the pros and cons of a minor subdivision.

Zoning Board – Councilmember Richter reported that the board heard one application for a 2nd floor deck and that the March 4th meeting has been canceled due to lack of applications.

Green Team – Councilmember Korman reported the following: The committee is working toward obtaining silver certification for Sustainable New Jersey; The committee is working on drafting a no smoking ordinance to propose to Borough Council.

Shade Tree Commission – Councilmember Korman reported that the commission is working on drafting an ordinance to provide set back tree protections in commercial zones to propose to Borough Council.

Jake DeNooyer - 79 Lake Drive, supports Ordinance 6-21 and asked a question about the proposed Wawa project.
